With the charging solutions of the Spanish manufacturer Circutor, the Netsuisse Group is adding European charging hardware to its portfolio. The Circutor Group is one of the leading European providers of solutions for energy efficiency and energy management. The offering is complemented by the integration of the Hubject eRoaming platform.

Charging hardware, connectivity via the Netsuisse Group's IoT solutions and the workforceOS software form an open toolkit – modular and API-first. Partners combine the building blocks exactly as they need them: as an end-to-end, single-source solution or as an individual component that fits into existing environments. Those already operating charging infrastructure can add connectivity or software as needed; those building from scratch receive the complete package. Existing technologies are integrated rather than replaced.

The three layers in detail: the charging hardware from Circutor, the connectivity via the Netsuisse Group's IoT solutions, and the workforceOS software for identity and access management and centralised billing.

This platform approach is complemented by the connection to Hubject, the world's leading provider of eRoaming solutions for electromobility. This gives operators direct access to an international roaming network and allows them to run their charging infrastructure across borders and across providers, whether as a charge point operator (CPO) or as an e-mobility provider (EMP). All building blocks can be combined modularly, scale flexibly and integrate seamlessly into existing business processes.

Whether connected fleet charging with centralised billing, charging infrastructure for real-estate portfolios or public charge points – the Netsuisse Group delivers the right combination of hardware, connectivity and software. Existing systems can be integrated across organisations.

A decisive factor for the partnership with Circutor was its consistently European development and manufacturing – from hardware to software. In a market with many non-European providers, the Netsuisse Group deliberately relies on European products and short distances. The engineering sites of both companies are located in close proximity to each other in Barcelona.
